West Mercia Police is currently in the process of its biggest recruitment drive in history with 68 new and experienced officers already allocated to South Worcestershire since August 2018.

The new recruits will be embedded into our local policing and help to increase the visibility of our Safer neighbourhood Teams (SNTs).

Our SNT play a vital role in the communities we serve and are at the heart of local policing.

Although, I am introducing our new quarterly updates – your next update will be from your local Safer Neighbourhood Inspector; who will keep you updated on local issues and initiatives in your area.

What are we doing?

Many of our county towns and parish councils have signed up or are in talks with and we hope will sign up to 'We Don't Buy Crime' that utilises SmartWater's forensic technology and warning signs in the area to protect our communities from burglars.

Academic research has shown the impact on reducing crime.

We have launched the Domestic Abuse Matters Champions. We have trained hundreds of front line staff with a nationally acclaimed course written by SafeLives.

And, we fully support Clare's Law that provides a formal mechanism to make enquiries about your partner if you are

What are we doing?

We are working with our partners in the Safer Roads Partnership to run initiatives all through the year to target the fatal four: mobiles, drink and drugs, speeding, seatbelts. This month we are out monitoring speed in the local community to help keep you all safe.



Exploitation

With an increase in national coverage of exploitation, including Child Sexual Exploitation and human trafficking we want to raise awareness of the signs and help to safeguard the vulnerable people in our communities.

What are we doing?



In partnership with the county council, NHS and various health and community partners we have launched the multi-agency initiative 'Get Safe'. At the recent launch across the North and South of the county your officers spoke to over 1000 people in the various local roadshows to raise awareness of exploitation.
